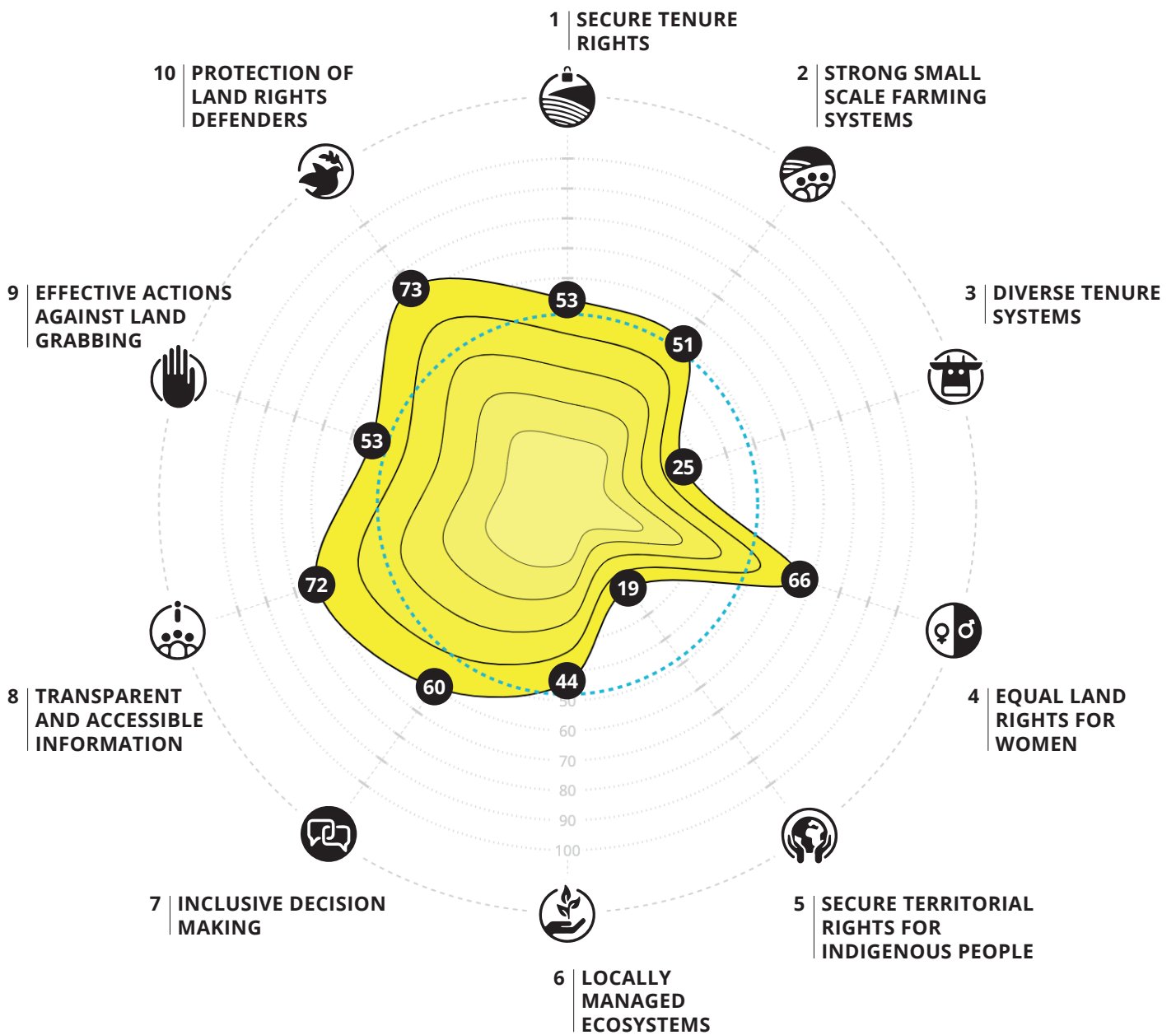

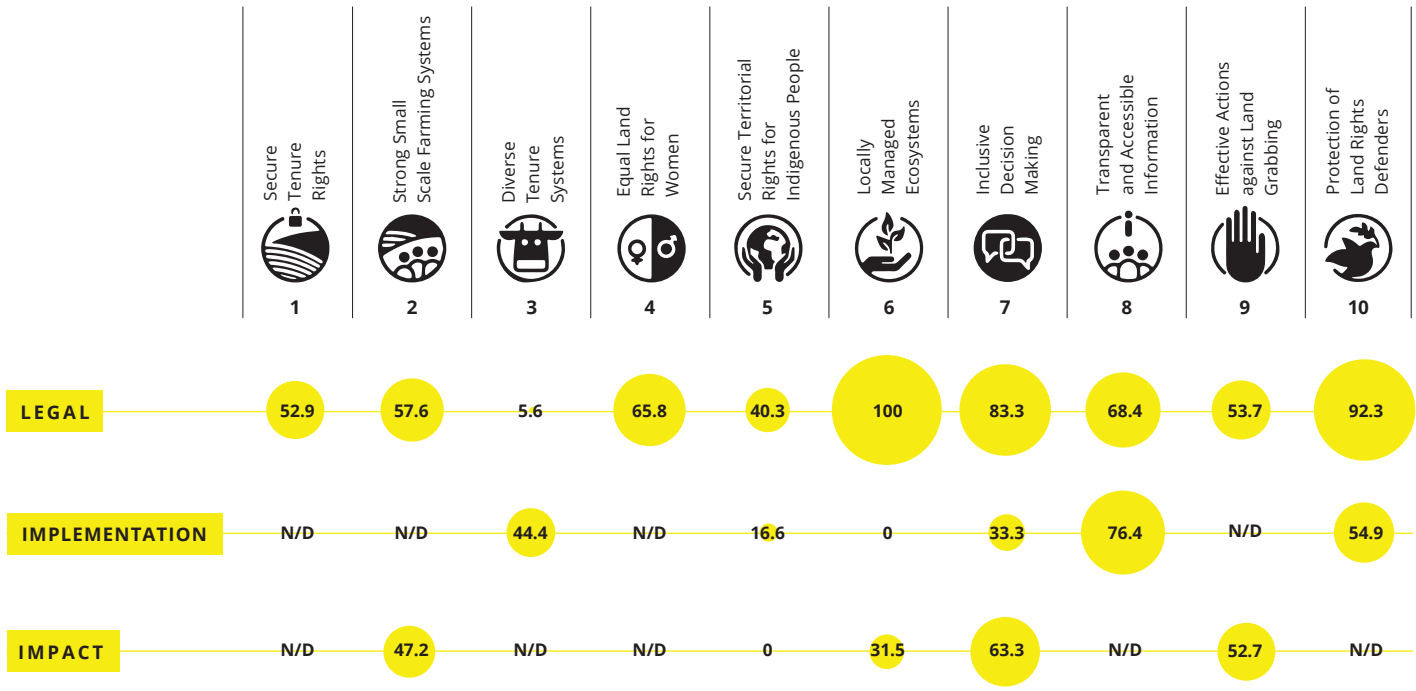

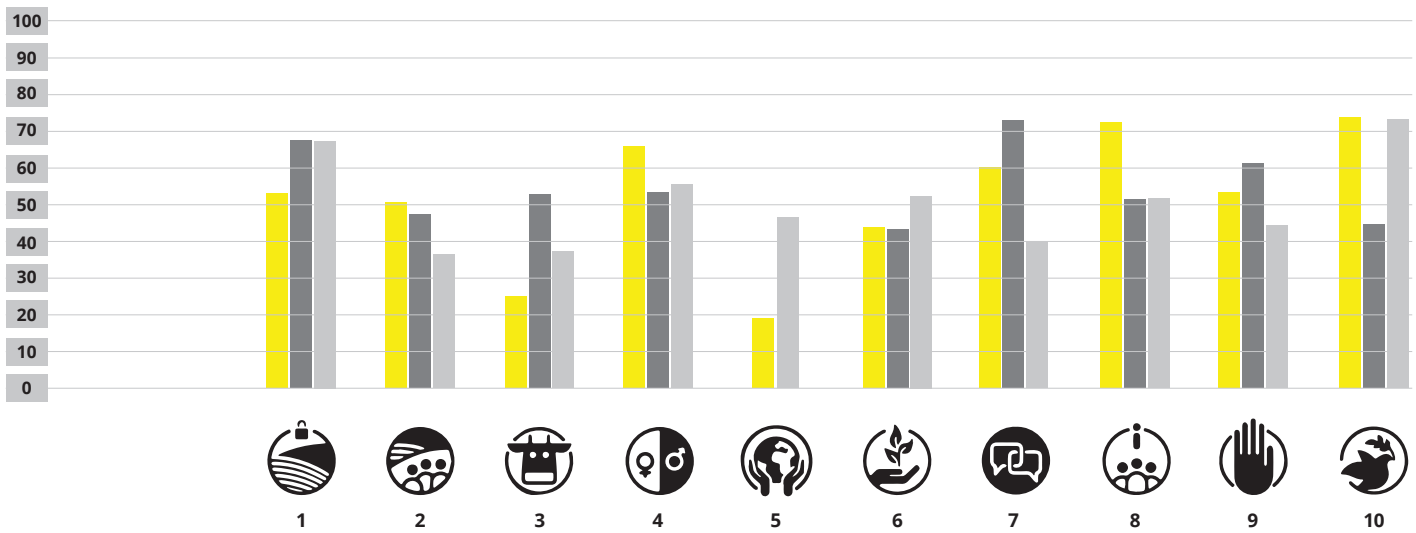

KEY OUTCOMES FOR NEPAL

Positive outcomes

- Strong recognition and implementation of protective measures for land and environment defenders (LEDs).
- Transparent, reliable and accessible data on land and land-related issues.

Room for improvement

- Weak recognition and implementation of diverse tenure rights and regimes.
- Implementation of tenure rights on indigenous lands is poor; a small amount of the land held or used by indigenous peoples is recognized.
